


Error installing Minecraft on Fedora22

The exception you are experiencing is described here. The problem is that Java believes you are attempting to run code which depends upon a mouse, keyboard, or display being available and one is not. One major thing to note: On the Minecraft website, it is stated: "Download Minecraft.jar (86 KB). The jar is executable and should work as-is, also please use Oracle's JVM." (https://minecraft.net/download). That said, my Fedora 21 system is using the OpenJDK just like yours and it works without issue. bitwiseoperator (May 31 '15)

If you execute yum list installed java*, do you see that you have both the java-1.8.0-openjdk.x86_64 package and the java-1.8.0-openjdk-headless.x86_64 package installed? 'Cause if you have only the latter, that might be the source of the trouble.

@bitwiseoperator I have my main screen turned off in settings, as half of the time it doesn't work. I think that might be why it throws the HeadlessException. I also have the openidk headless and the regular open idk installed.

Falcon2_0 (May 31 '15)
