Etymology

Said to have been adapted by George Lucas from Japanese 時代劇 (*jidaigeki*) (meaning "period drama" motion pictures about samurai), or perhaps inspired by with the words *Jed* (King) and *Jeddak* (Emperor) in the Barsom series by Edgar Rice Burroughs, a series that Lucas considered adapting to film.
