Tier	Letters	Explanation / Comment
Olympic	α β γ δ ε θ λ μ π σ	Impossible to confuse with Latin letters, widespread conventions on their meaning in economic or statistical formulas, very useful
Heroic	χ τ ω	Of some use but care must be taken to distinguish them from Latin letters
Exotic	φ ψ	Of some use but rare in practice for unknown reasons
Mortal	ι κ ο υ	Easily confused with the equivalent Latin letters, therefore of no use
Cursed	η ν ρ	Easily confused with Latin letters they are not even equivalent to
Damned	ζ ξ	Literally just random squiggles, impossible to consistently write
