Paramount to pay Trump \$16m to settle 60 Minutes lawsuit 2 July 2025 Share < Save 🔲

Trump filed a lawsuit last October, alleging the network had deceptively edited an interview that aired on its 60 Minutes news programme with his presidential election rival Kamala Harris, to "tip the scales in favour of the Democratic party". Paramount said it would pay to settle the suit, but with the money allocated to Trump's

The company noted the settlement does not include a statement of apology or regret.


