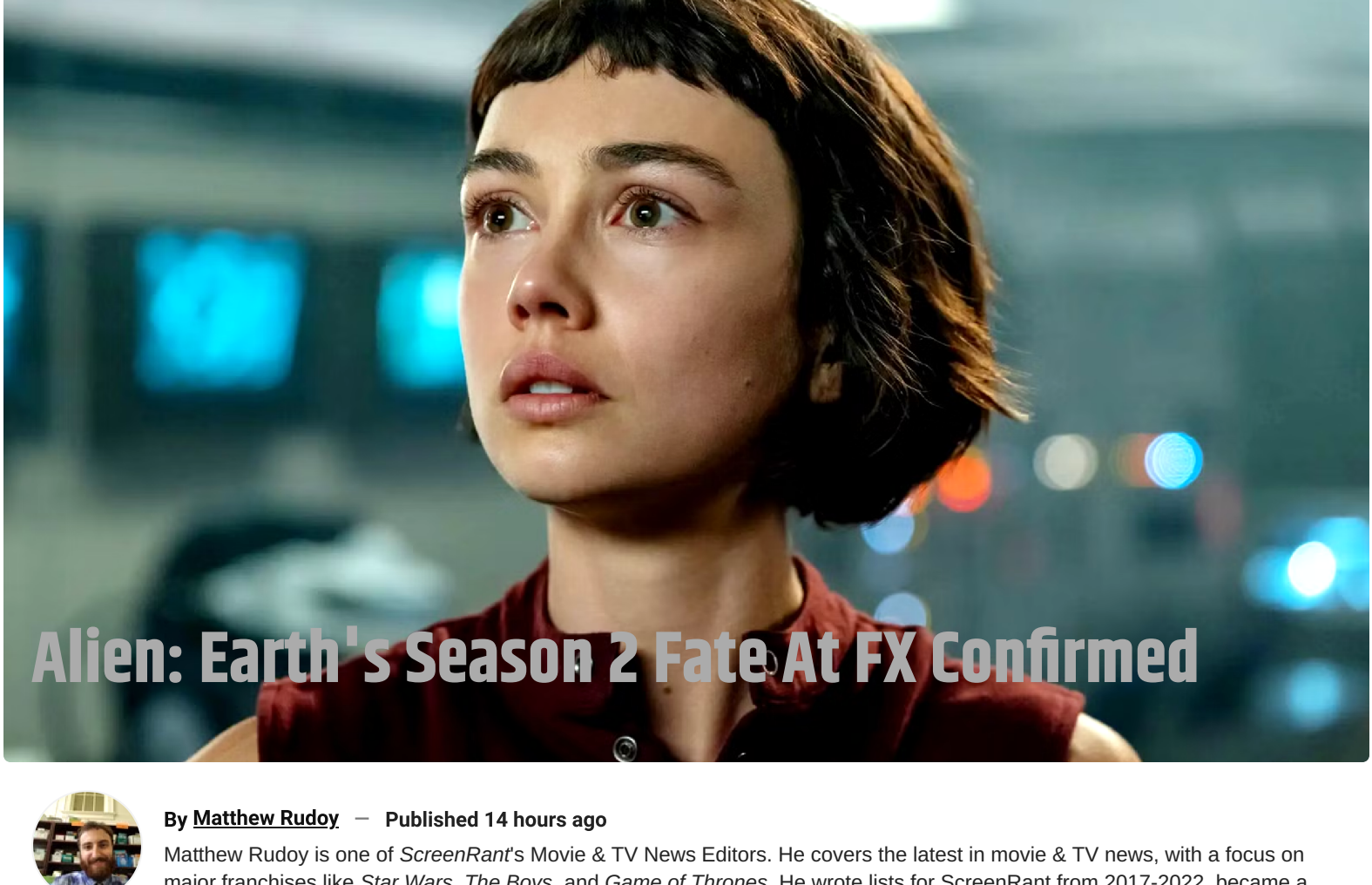

Alien: Earth season 2's fate has finally been revealed. After the season 1 finale was released on September 23, fans have been waiting to see whether the hit series will continue. As evidenced by the 94% "Certified Fresh" critical score on Rotten Tomatoes and Metacritic Must-Watch score of 85, *Alien: Earth's* [reviews](#) were incredibly positive, as the franchise's first television show received significant praise for its cinematic and original storytelling.

Now, FX has confirmed that *Alien: Earth* has been renewed for season 2 and filming is set to start in London in 2026. Season 2 will debut on FX and Hulu in the United States and on Disney+ internationally.

The renewal comes as the show's creator, Noah Hawley, signs a new overall deal with Disney Entertainment Television. Check out statements about the renewal and Hawley's new deal below from FX Chairman John Landgraf and Eric Schrier, President of Disney Television Studios & Global Original Television Strategy:

John Landgraf: It has been our great privilege to work with Noah for more than a decade on some of FX's best and biggest shows, and we are thrilled to extend our partnership well into the future. Noah never stops surprising us with truly original stories— and his unique ability to bring them to vibrant life as a director and producer as well as writer makes him extraordinary. We can't wait to get to work on the next season of Alien: Earth, as well as some equally exciting future projects in advanced development.

Eric Schrier: I learned first-hand that Noah was a unique talent while we worked on Fargo at FX. He has gone on to make many of the best shows in television, and I couldn't be more excited that Noah will continue his FX partnership and broaden it across Disney Entertainment Television.

Hawley also released a statement about his new deal, his gratitude to FX for supporting his work since *Fargo* in 2014, and how excited he is to continue *Alien: Earth*.

I'm thrilled that this expanded deal opens the door to new opportunities across all of Disney Entertainment Television. FX has always supported bold, character-driven storytelling. From the very beginning with Fargo, they've encouraged me to take creative risks and follow the story wherever it leads. I'm grateful to continue exploring the world of Alien: Earth alongside our partners, cast, and crew as we begin the next chapter.

The aftermath of Wendy's takeover in *Alien: Earth* season 1's ending will be explored, along with other key storylines, now that the prequel is officially returning. Season 2 will also see the show drawing closer to the timeline of the original *Alien* (1979) movie and the events involving Ellen Ripley (Sigourney Weaver) aboard the *Nostromo*.

Since the series has only just been renewed and filming is set to begin in 2026, the most likely release window is 2027, which would put an approximately two-year hiatus between seasons.

While Hawley's immediate focus is *Alien: Earth* season 2, his statement and new deal indicate that he will be taking on other projects as well for FX and Disney. Before *Alien: Earth*, he was also the creator and showrunner of FX's *Fargo* and *Legion*, and all three series have received extensive critical acclaim and been renewed for multiple seasons.

The season 2 cast has not been confirmed yet, but Sydney Chandler, Alex Lawther, Essie Davis, Babou Ceesay, Samuel Blenkin, and Timothy Olyphant are expected to return.

Confirmation of *Alien: Earth* season 2 being renewed comes less than a week after the theatrical debut of *Predator: Badlands*, which contains significant connections to the *Alien* franchise. Between ***Alien: Earth*** continuing and *Predator: Badlands* having a record-breaking opening weekend at the box office, it has been a significant week for both iconic science-fiction franchises.
