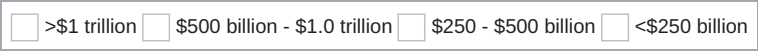

Each province's GDP is listed in both the national currency [renminbi](#) (CNY), and at nominal [U.S. dollar](#) values according to annual average exchange rates. [Purchasing power parity](#) (PPP) index changes frequently, and its relevant data is not included in the main table, only included at the end of the entry. PPP reference comes from the [World Economic Outlook](#) published by the [International Monetary Fund](#) (IMF). The [average CNY exchange rate](#) used here is from the [China NBS](#), and [CNY PPP exchange rates](#) are estimated according to the IMF.
